The DofE Bronze Award has three sections plus an Expedition, which lasts for two days and one night. The sections include Volunteering in the local community, a Physical activity of

their choice e.g. dance, rugby, badminton and a Skills section which could include joining a band, choir or learning piping and drumming. All sections have an assessor and suitable goals agreed for the pupil to work towards. The time spent on each section averages at least 1 hour per week. The Duke of Edinburgh's Bronze Award requires the participant to be at least 14 years old and to spend 3 months on each section of the award plus an additional 3 months on one section.

Thanks to all the dedicated staff, Firrhill High School is now able to offer Silver and Gold DofE to a limited number of pupils.






Firrhill Pipe Band Club



The Celebration Garden was designed and created by Audrey Timmins and Ruth Gebbie, Firrhill parents, with the help of the Eco and Environment Groups, as part of Firrhill's 50th anniversary celebrations. The Parent Council donated a commemorative plaque which is in the school concourse and further plaque in the garden, marks a tree planted by the Lord Provost. The red Moongate panels, native elm logs, sleeper benches and "cobble river" are among the structural features. The planting represents grasses by the edge of a river. 

A great opportunity to choose Christmas gifts from a wide variety of stalls, enjoy entertainment and festive favre.


