NEXT STEPS

PRIORITY I

Students access the National Occupational Standards (NOS) which are the basis of training in hair, beauty, nails and spa and form the backbone of NVQs, SVQs & apprenticeships as well as professional codes of practice.



COURSES OFFERED

At Firrhill we have an in-house, industry standard hair-dressing salon. Students have the opportunity to experience an introduction to hairdressing through elective courses offered in S2 and S3 before progressing into the National 5 Skills for Work course in the senior phase.

Candidates will develop their skills in shampooing, conditioning, basic scalp massage, drying hair, colouring hair and will learn about current fashion trends, with the opportunity to experiment & produce a style that reflects these. This course develops the skills, knowledge and attitudes, needed for work in the industry. It provides practical experience of general salon duties, reception skills, communication and customer care. The focus is on experiencing the salon environment and developing vocational skills, knowledge and understanding. The course comprises the following mandatory units:
